From the Principal - Ms Reeves

Curriculum Review

We are conducting a curriculum review Term 1, 2018, to evaluate our approach to whole school technology and to ensure Muirfield's curriculum is rigorous and responsive. The review team will investigate whether our students' patterns of study and use of technology is meeting community expectations and rising to the challenges of the future.



The team will look at three aspects in particular:

- ◆ Subjects studied in Years 7 to 10
- ◆ STEM
- ◆ Muirfield's approach to BYOD



STEM

What is STEM?

STEM is a curriculum based on the idea of educating students in four specific disciplines — science, technology, engineering and mathematics - in an interdisciplinary and applied approach. Rather than teach the four disciplines as separate and discrete subjects, STEM integrates them into a cohesive subject based on real-world applications.

Why is STEM so important?

"In the 21st century, scientific and technological innovations have become increasingly important as we face the benefits and challenges of both globalization and a knowledge-based economy. To succeed in this new information-based and highly technological society, students need to develop their capabilities in STEM to levels much beyond what was considered acceptable in the past." ([National Science Foundation](#))

The Australian government want us to encourage students to study STEM subjects to help secure the nation's future in these areas of employment. They believe that starting this interest at the school level will help increase the number of students taking up STEM subjects in higher education and in their careers and help keep Australia competitive internationally in these important fields.

What is BYOD?

Student Bring Your Own Device Policy (BYOD) allows students to use personal mobile electronic devices at school, with the capability of connecting to the department's wi-fi network. Currently, Muirfield students can bring any device, however, they can also choose not to bring a device. Other approaches include families buying a specific device for their child to use at school or families purchasing any device that meets a minimum specification.

Review Process

The review team will listen to the views of students, parents and teachers through focus groups and surveys. This input is vital to the recommendations and decisions. If any recommendations for change are made, they will be for the 2019 school year or beyond.

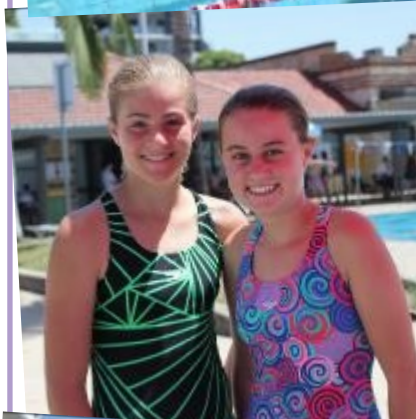
Congratulations to Thorpe, the triumphant house of the day, and to their wonderful captains who encouraged their team members throughout the day. Participation was the key to success.

Study Without Stress Workshops

Muirfield's Wellbeing Team is offering our Year 12 students the unique opportunity to be part of a program aimed at reducing the symptoms of academic stress in Year 12. This program is endorsed by Macquarie University's Centre for Emotional Wellbeing.



The program involves students attending group sessions across 6 weeks, during which the students learn about the components of stress, and the skills to manage stress, and then students practice these skills with their peers. Students will be asked to practise these skills taught in the group during the weeks in between sessions. In previous years the feedback has been extremely positive from students. - Follow registration instructions or sign in if you have already registered.
- Use the search tool at the top right of screen to search for "Muirfield High School" or if you have 'location' enabled in your phone settings, just select "Muirfield High School"
- Complete the student profile for each child.
- Select the Winter black jacket from the Menu.
- Proceed to select the correct size and number of jackets required.
- Then proceed to your shopping cart to add your card details for payment.

What if I don't have a smart phone?

You can use Qkr! online. You will need to register and you will then be able to order uniforms online. Go to <https://qkr.mastercard.com/for-everyone-australia/> and select "Use Qkr! Online"

How do I collect uniform items?

You will be notified via the registered email address when the Black Fleece Jacket orders will be available for collection by students. Jackets are anticipated to be ready for collection in May.

ANSTO Excursion

On Thursday 2nd March Year 11 Chemistry went on an excursion to the nuclear reactor at the ANSTO Discovery Centre, Lucas Heights. This excursion was undertaken to support the new Chemistry syllabus introduced this year. Students were introduced to the purpose and history of the reactor by ANSTO staff. The scientist who led our group was a working member of the team whose other job is to test the purity of the isotopes used for medical purposes.



Students participated in an experiment measuring the radioactivity of substances and the effectiveness of shielding from radiation levels. They then went on a tour of the facility to see the reactor (only on a video feed) and the various other instruments used by scientists to conduct research. These included instruments named after Australian animals such as DINGO, WOMBAT, ECHIDNA and KOOKABURRA. These all have different purposes for different types of enquiry such as imaging inside materials.

Other research projects ANSTO supports are isotope tracing in waterways and natural systems and radiocarbon dating of samples. Students also learnt about all the different radioactive isotopes produced by ANSTO and their uses in industry and medicine.
