Semester One Reports

Cyber Safety Update - Office of the eSafety Commissioner Resources

Children and teenagers spend a lot of time online, using social media. While many enjoy their online experiences, there are risks involved. Parents, schools and the broader community need to work together to help keep children's online experiences safe.

The Commonwealth Office of the Children's eSafety Commissioner has developed a resource for parents – iPARENT – which helps parents deal with the connected devices in their children's lives.

iPARENT – found at <https://esafety.gov.au/education-resources/iparent> - provides facts and statistics about Australian children online, managing technology in the home and strategies that can be used by parents to keep children safe online.

A parent's guide to online safety can be downloaded from this site. A range of other useful information is also available from the website. For example parents can access information about cyberbullying including:

- How to talk to their child about cyberbullying;
- What to do if their child is being cyber bullied or is engaging in cyberbullying behaviour themselves; and
- Sources of professional support and help.

The website also provides information about how parents and children can report unwanted online contact and/or inappropriate, offensive or illegal content online.

Spirit Week

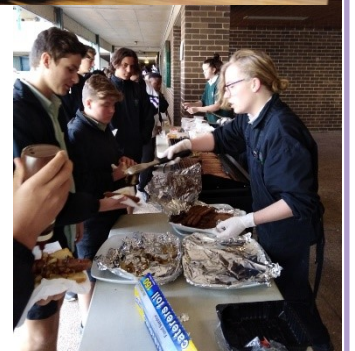
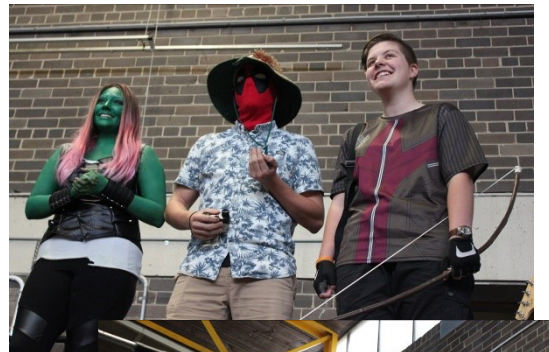
In Week 6 we held SRC's annual Spirit Week. We had different activities running through the week on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday.

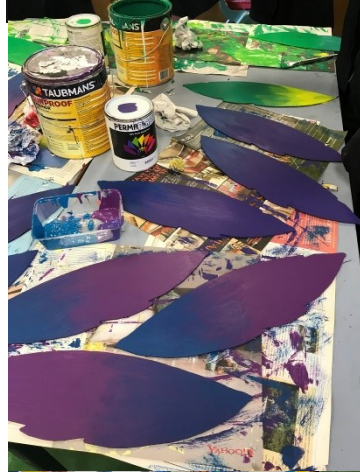

Improving the online payment experience for parents and carers

Westpac are making changes to the Parent Online Payment (POP) portal between 11 and 25 June 2018.

Customised for your school

The new payment portal page can be customised to include your school colours, logo and a page header.

Easier to use

- Collapsible sections have grouped information in a more logical order making the form easier to use
- Browser auto-fill will allow parents and carers to make payments without having to re-enter details
- More time to enter details
- Larger controls to make it easier to use on mobile screens
- Allow payment via a credit card or direct debit from a bank account

Supported School Transport and the National Disability Insurance Scheme

The Australian Government has released a discussion paper about 'Supported School Transport and the National Disability Insurance Scheme' on their website <https://engage.dss.gov.au>.

As the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is rolled out across Australia, this paper asks for your feedback on how supported school transport could work under the NDIS.

This is your opportunity to have your say via a submission on how you would like to see supported school transport operate in our State. The consultation period will end on 20 July at 5:00pm.

Healthy School Canteen Strategy

The NSW Department of Education has adopted a Healthy School canteen strategy and all public school canteens are required to meet the standards by 2019.

There are detailed guidelines that assist school canteens to implement the strategy. The food and drink criteria are based on the Australian Dietary Guidelines and work on a health star rating.

In order to help school canteens plan their menus, foods are identified as either Everyday or Occasional foods. The criteria for balancing Everyday vs Occasional foods on the menu is summarised as follows:

Everyday	Occasional
At least $\frac{3}{4}$ of the menu.	No more than $\frac{1}{4}$ of the menu.
No Health Star Rating (HSR) cut-off.	Health Star Rating (HSR) of 3.5 stars and above.
Portion limits for flavoured milk, juice and ready-to-eat meals.	Portion limits for all Occasional food and drinks.
Display, favourably price, promote and advertise Everyday choices.	Occasional food and drinks not promoted at point of sale.
*Sugary drinks are not to be sold in NSW public schools.

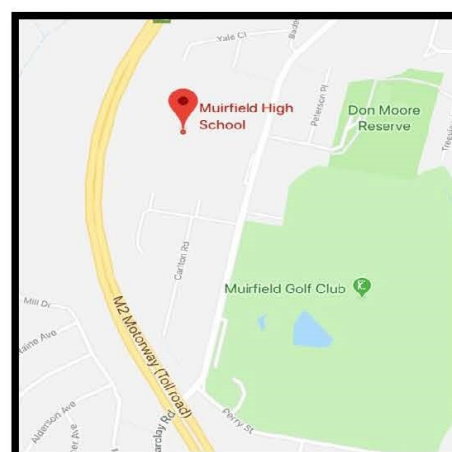
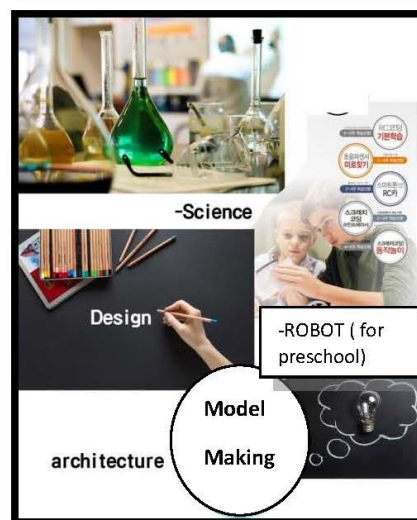
