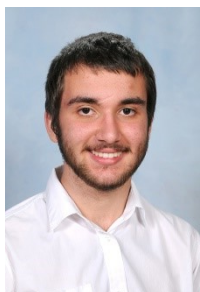

To conclude, we would like to take this opportunity to wish the incoming Student Executive Team the best of luck as the year heads into 2020.

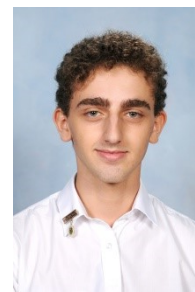

There have been so many lasts this year. Last swimming carnival, last athletics carnival and even last high school assignment but this year also marks the start of our adult lives which we

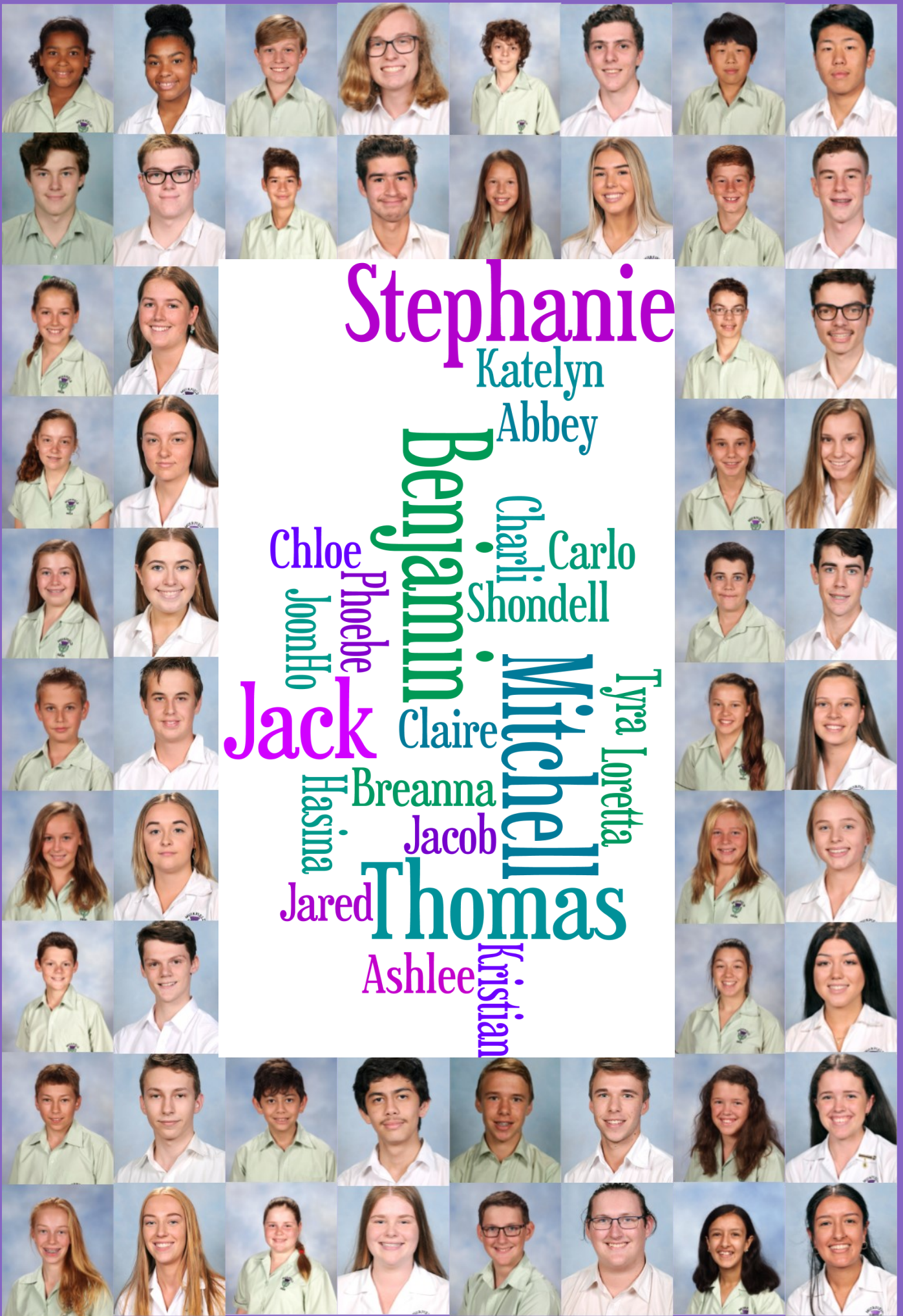
are all eager to begin. So, thank you to Muirfield High School for providing an amazing place to learn and grow as people, as we prepare to be released into the real world.

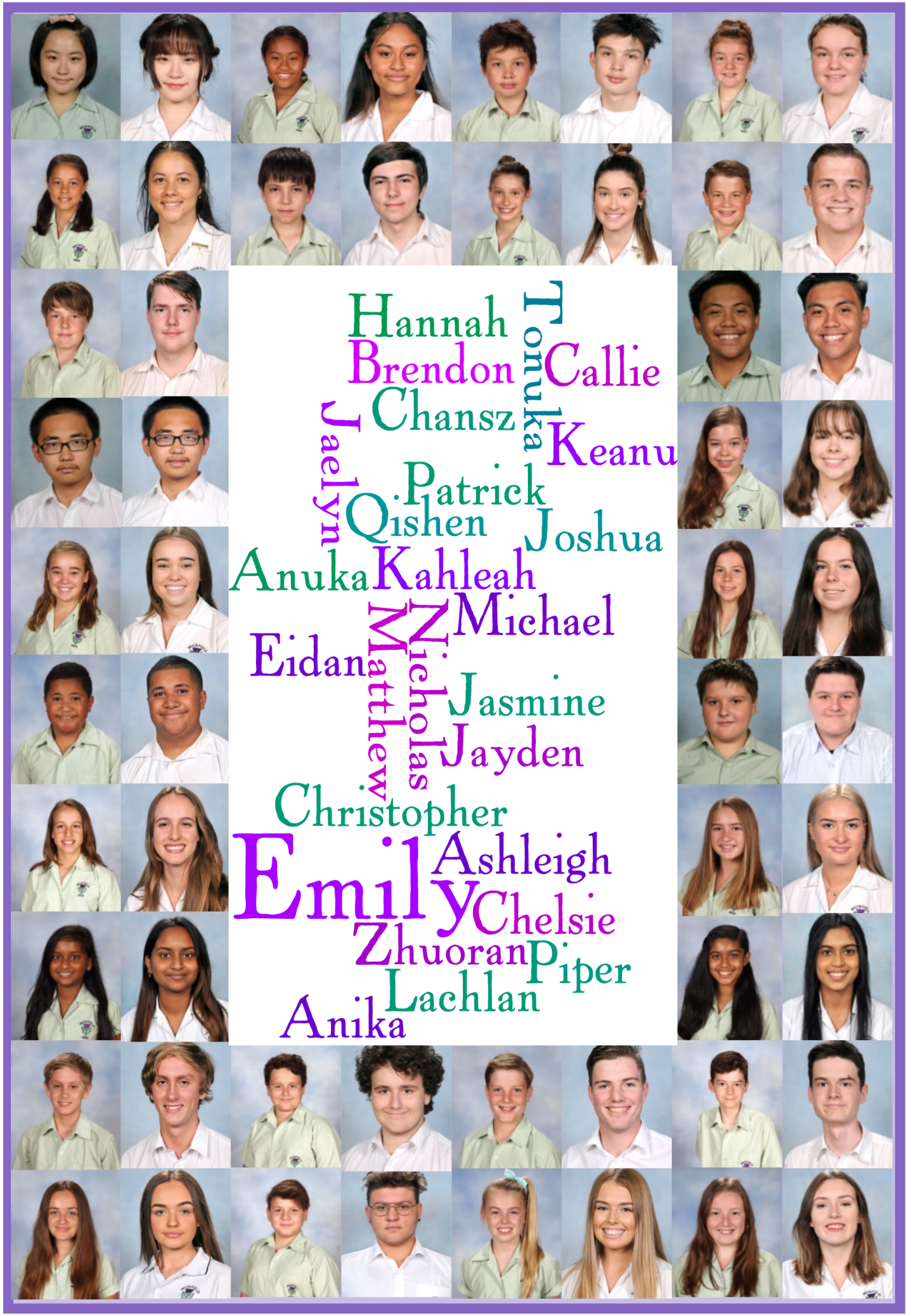

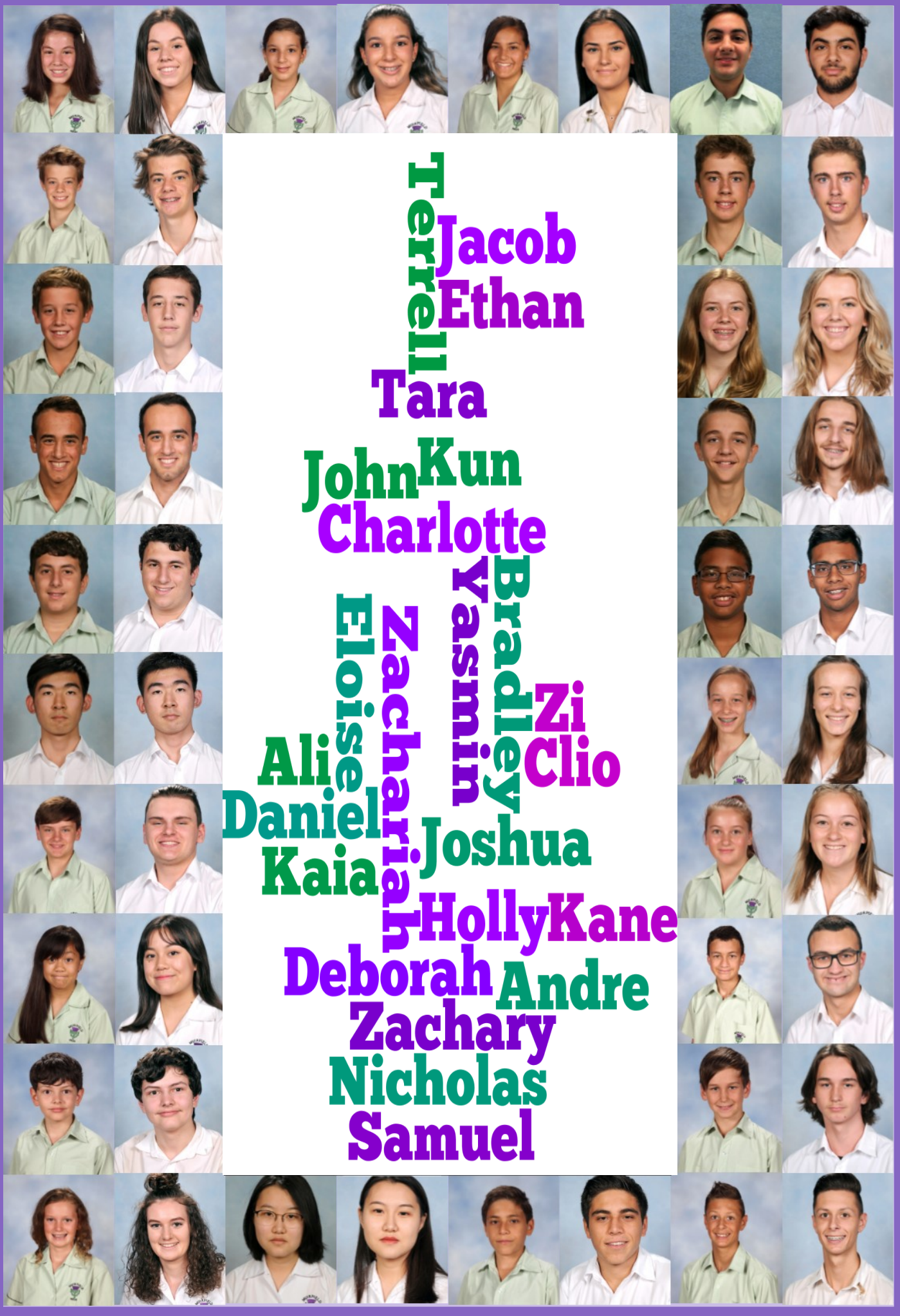

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the parents, guardians and extended



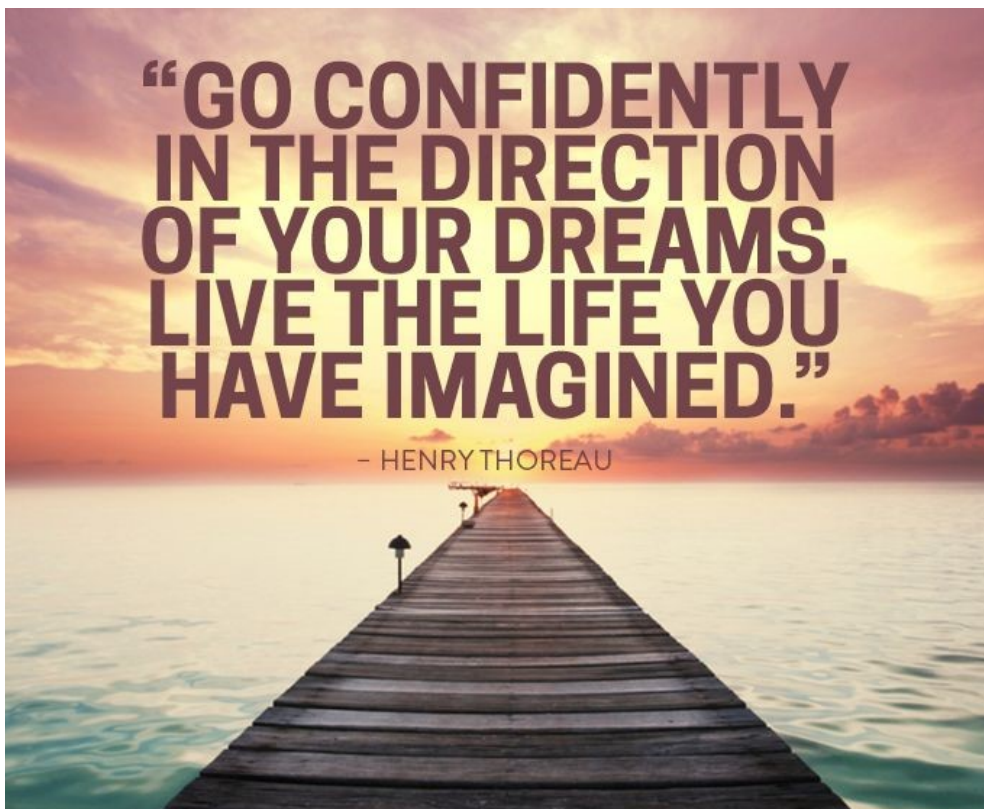

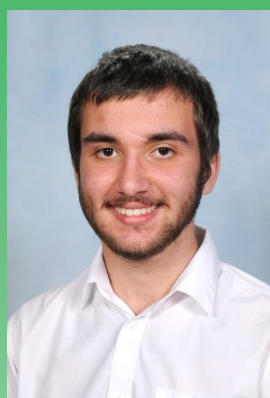
