## From the Deputy Principal - Ms. Hosen



This is an extremely busy time for both students and staff, with end of year assessments being finalised. ### HSC Completed

Year 12 have now completed their HSC external examinations and it has been with great pride to hear from Mrs Schwager, our NESA HSC Presiding Officer, that our students enthusiastically tackled their examinations with great diligence and commitment. As the supervisor of the HSC examinations at Muirfield for more than 10 years, this is the final year that Mrs Schwager will take on this role. We thank her for her continued service to NESA and to Muirfield. We appreciate her efficient administration and organisation skills, and for providing a friendly and reassuring face to the many students who have entered her examination room over the years.

Congratulations are extended to all our HSC students who are now able to relax and unwind as we all eagerly await the results, which will be released on Friday 18 December. ATAR results will be available on the UAC site on the same day. We look forward to our Year 12 students joining us on this day at 11.00am for a celebratory BBQ lunch in the senior courtyard.

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### **Year 11 and so it begins for you ...**

This term, our Year 11 students began their HSC studies in earnest. Students have been given a copy of the HSC Assessment Policy and it is vital that students take time to understand the rules, policies and procedures outlined in the booklet. Assessment schedules, including dates due for all tasks, are also included.

All classwork and assessment from Day 1 of Term 4 contributes to the successful award of the HSC. Some students are taking up the challenge of extension courses, while others are consolidating their curriculum pattern and opting to continue courses best suited to their skills and abilities. All Year 11 must maintain their focus and work hard right to the end of Term 4.

### **End of 2020 and Start of 2021 Arrangements**

School will conclude for summer holidays on Wednesday 16 December. A reminder that the Department of Education has changed the scheduling of Staff Development Days (SDDs) in 2021.

Term 1 2021 will commence with the first two days being SDDs, whereas the two SDDs at the end of Term 4 have reduced to one. Terms 2 and 3 will remain the same, with each of them commencing with a Staff Development Day.

- Years 7, 11 and 12 will recommence school on Friday 29 January,
- Years 8, 9 and 10 to follow on Monday 1 February.

### Presentation Assembly

Traditionally at Muirfield, our end of year Presentation Ceremony is conducted in the evening, with parents welcome to join us in our school hall to celebrate student achievement.

Recent Department of Education policy has allowed functions of this type to go ahead, however schools will need to comply with COVID-19 Safety Plans which include the requirement for 4 square metres of space per person attending regardless of their age.

Unfortunately, the Muirfield school hall cannot cater for this distancing rule. As such, our Presentation Assembly has been rescheduled to 10am on Tuesday 15 December for students only. We are investigating ways to stream this ceremony live to parents so they can share in this rewarding and wonderful day of recognition. Further information will be sent home to parents later in the term.

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, Summer Arts will be a virtual presentation. More details will be sent home shortly.



### NAIDOC Week and Remembrance Day

At Muirfield, we acknowledge that we are on Dharug land, whose people are the traditional custodians of the land we learn on. The cultures and customs of all nations, particularly the Dharug, have nurtured and continue to nurture this land since the Dreaming.

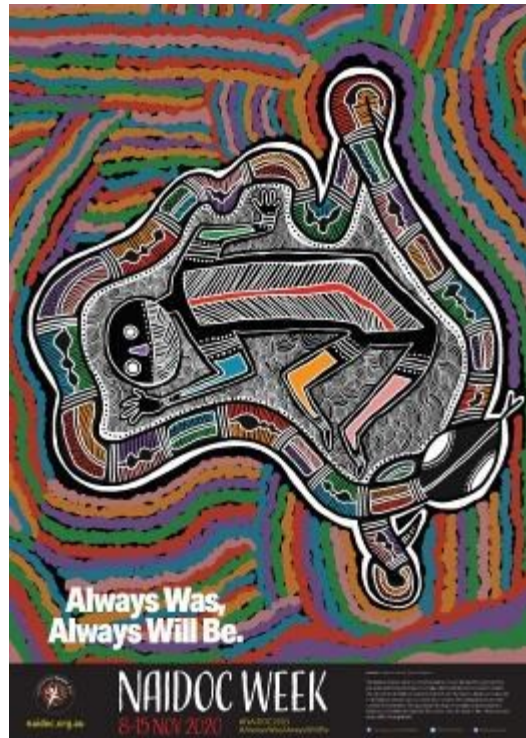
This always was and always will be Aboriginal land. We recognise Aboriginal Australians' continuing connection



to the country, water and community. We pay our respect to elders, past, present and emerging.

This week marks NAIDOC week 2020. The theme is Always Was, Always Will Be and reflects the connection Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have had with the land. Members of our SRC spoke poignantly at our whole school assembly about the struggles of indigenous Australians and acknowledged their history, culture and achievements.

NAIDOC Week assembly also coincided with Remembrance Day. At 11am on 11 November, the Last Post was expertly played by Year 11 student, Tolstoy Wilkinson, and could be heard in every classroom through our new speaker system. This followed by a minute of silence, dedicated to the deceased, especially for soldiers who died fighting to protect our nation.



## Uniform

During this year, the value of parent and community support has been immeasurable to the staff and the school, particularly through the challenges presented by COVID. Some family's circumstances have changed and are in need of support with uniforms. If you have unwanted uniform items we are requesting that you please donate these to the school. 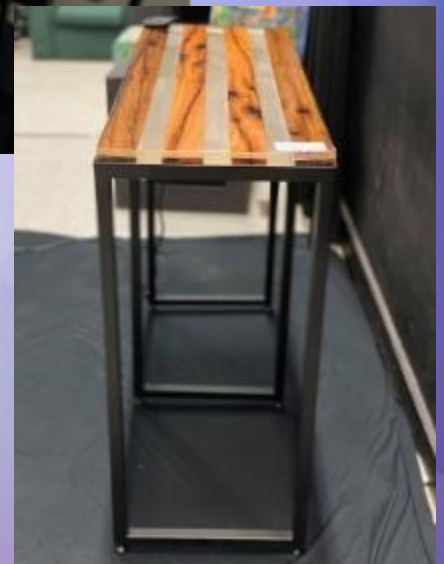
# HSC Design and Technology Major Design Projects

"Recently our HSC Design and Technology students submitted their Major Design Project (MDP). All students faced a difficult time this year due to the global pandemic, however, this did not stop our Muirfield students in successfully completing their MDP's. "As designers, we are also constantly seeking ways to up cycle, re-purpose or recycle unwanted items. I designed and produced a resin side board table using repurposed timber train sleepers. The product integrated an arduino board which was coded to switch between multi coloured LED lights. Additionally, I integrated a USB port and power point to conveniently charge any devices."

### **Pindone Rabbit baiting in The Hills Shire Parks and Reserves**

Grazing by the European Rabbit has a major impact on our environment. The Hills Shire Council in conjunction with Local Land Services is co-ordinating a rabbit baiting program in Council's parks and reserves. This program aims to protect native flora, and reduce the amount of damage to grassed areas.

The program is undertaken as per the Pesticide Control (Pindone Products) Order 2010. This process involves an initial preparation period where non-poison carrot is laid. This allows measurement of the existing rabbit population. Carrots baited with Pindone will then be placed in each reserve on three evenings during the advertised period. Any uneaten Pindone will be removed the following mornings.

**This rabbit baiting program will run from Monday 9th November to Tuesday 17th November 2020.**

The following reserves will be closed to all people and their pets during these following periods:

- midday the 9<sup>th</sup> November (Monday), to midday 10<sup>th</sup> November (Tuesday) 2020; and
- midday 12<sup>th</sup> November (Thursday), to midday 13<sup>th</sup> November (Friday) 2020; and
- midday 16<sup>th</sup> November (Monday), to midday 17<sup>th</sup> November (Tuesday) 2020.

The pesticide is lethal to dogs and cats and if consumed can cause illness to humans. Contact your local vet or seek medical advice in the case of suspected poisoning.

Reserves participating in this program are Castle Hill Heritage Park, Castle Hill; and Bella Vista Farm, Bella Vista, and Equinox Road Reserve, Box Hill.

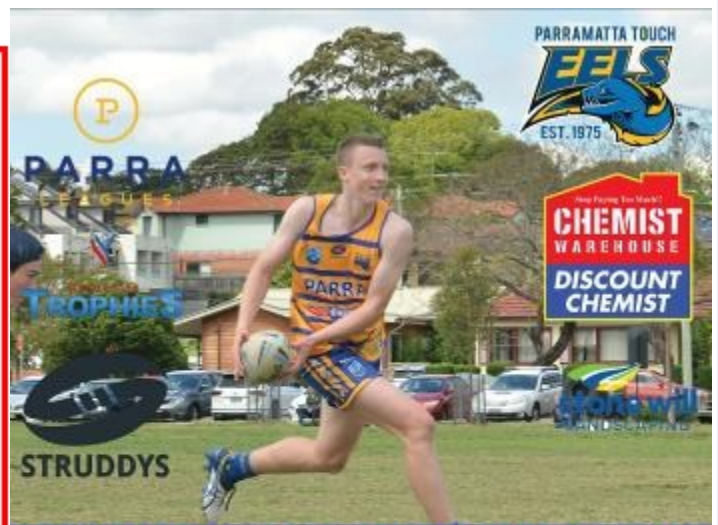
