Year 7 Camp

As part of our Peer Support Program, Year 7 and Year 11 Peer Support leaders took the annual pilgrimage up the M1 to The Great Aussie Bush Camp during Week 5 of this term.

Apart from the opportunity for students to establish new friendships, a large element of the camp focuses on enhancing resilience, increasing self-esteem and providing opportunities for them to take calculated risks, work as a team and push themselves to their limits.

The high ropes, power fan, abseiling, kayaking, Survivor Island, raft building and the giant swing courses are designed to provide students with a chance to safely go beyond their comfort zones, at a pace that



feels right for them. I was fortunate enough to attend part of the camp and was extremely proud of the way students challenged themselves.

It was great to witness how students approached each activity with enthusiasm and a 'give it a go' attitude, as well as the encouragement and support they provided to one another to complete the activities. In some cases you could see their legs shaking as they left the safety of the wooded platform to "tightrope" across various challenges, but always present were the calls of encouragement and positivity from their peers.

Personal determination, combined with instruction and encouragement from the group, resulted in most students successfully completing the challenges. All the teachers were impressed by our new Year 7 cohort, and the compliments students received from the camp staff were overwhelming.

The camp was also an opportunity for our Year 11 Peer Support leaders to refine their leadership skills and further develop a rapport with the Year 7 students. The peer leaders were fantastic role models, displaying maturity beyond their years. This was noted by all Muirfield staff and the camp supervisors. A job well done!

Please remember that all items of uniform are available throughout the year from the Uniform Shop.

With our new online ordering system in place, parents now have much more flexibility when ordering uniforms for their child.

Students are still encouraged though, to come into the Uniform Shop during Monday lunchtime trade, to try on items for sizing. Items can then be purchased in the shop using cash, cheque or card or, at a later date/time using the Qkr app.

All uniform items will be able to be purchased through the online purchasing app, Qkr! - see instruction sheet following. Qkr is a secure, encrypted app run by Mastercard. Both debit cards & credit cards can be used.

All orders made on Qkr for a Monday lunchtime pickup (12.30pm to 1.30pm), must be placed by midnight the Sunday before.

Black Fleece Jackets - Limited stock and sizes are available in the shop until sold out. Purchases of Black Fleece Jackets can only be made in the Uniform Shop. They are not available to order via the QKR App.

Step 3 Start shopping

Choose the next Monday delivery. Select the items you want, add to Cart, then Checkout when you are finished. You can view and print a receipt (or email it) if required.

Step 4 Collect purchase

Students pick up their uniform items during Monday lunchtime opening 12:30 – 1:30pm. (Orders to be placed by Sunday midnight for Monday pick up)

Regional Fox Baiting Program

Please be advised that a fox baiting program will soon commence in the local area in conjunction with Greater Sydney Local Land Services. The aim of the program is to protect native wildlife including threatened species from fox predation.

1080 poison baits will be laid in the following Reserves:

- Excelsior Reserve, North Rocks;
- Ted Horwood Reserve, Baulkham Hills;
- Eric Mobbs Reserve, Castle Hill; and
- Holland Road Reserve, Glenhaven.

Foxoff® poison or meat baits (containing 1080)

will be buried in the above listed reserves between

Monday 24th February – Friday 13th March 2020

Foxoff[®] is designed specifically for fox control. Trained staff will undertake the baiting. Baits will be buried 10cm under the ground to reduce the risk of non-target poisoning.

WARNING:

- 1080 poison is lethal to dogs and cats
- The above listed bushland reserves will be closed to dogs (including dogs walking on a lead), during and up to 4 weeks after the fox baiting program.
- Dogs on leads can return to these reserves on Saturday 11th April 2020.

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2020 ROWING TALENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

INTRODUCTION

The Academy is partnering Nepean Rowing Club in an exciting talent identification and development program, searching for our future Olympians. We are seeking young athletes dedicated to sport and ready to commit to a development program - regardless of any lack of experience in rowing.

The Academy-Nepean Rowing Club program will involve an initial sixweek assessment period for those male and female athletes selected from nominations. This period will enable the athlete to confirm their desire and talent to continue participation in the full program, and coaching staff to assess the potential of the athlete to progress to the next level along the pre-elite development pathway.

The Rowing Program will provide opportunities for athletes to receive technical (coaching) support from Nepean Rowing Club's Head Coach, as well as educational knowledge across key topics such as nutrition, banned substances, cyber safety and sports injury management. Athletes will also receive personal development opportunities including media and corporate partner exposure, be nominated for awards and attenda range of events.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Athletes nominating must reside within the Academy's geographic catchment including the following local Government areas: Blacktown, Blue Mountains, Fairfield, Hawkesbury, City of Parramatta, Penrith and The Hills Shire.

Male and female athletes aged between 14 and 18 years of age will be eligible to nominate for selection in the program. Nominations will be called for from Monday 2nd March requiring athletes to undertake an online registration using the Academy's website.

Selection assessment days will be conducted at Nepean Rowing Club on Saturday 11th April (12noon-2pm), Thursday 16th April (9am-11am), Wednesday 22nd April (4pm-6pm) and Sunday 26th April (10am-12noon), following which athletes will be advised if they will be invited to participate in an initial six-week assessment program.

At the conclusion of the six-week period, coaching staff will advise of those athletes invited to continue in the full program which will be undertaken from 22nd June 2020 through to May 2021.

BENEFITS

Athletes selected in the Talent Identification and Development Program will receive the following benefits:

Access to NSW5 high standard rowing facilities;
 An individualized technical program provided by Nepean Rowing.

Club coaching staff;

- A foundation in the technical and educational knowledge required to progress to the elite levels of the sport;
- Opportunity to attend Academy events, Nepean Rowing Club competitions, nominate for media and partner awards/scholars hips;
- Opportunities to receive benefits from Academy partners including gym membership and professional sports medicine services.

COST

There will be no cost associated with the initial component of the Academy/NRC assessment period over the first six weeks. Athletes will be required to commit to attending all scheduled sessions to enable a full assessment.

At the conclusion of the program, athletes offered a scholarship within the Academy Program will be required to pay an Academy levy of \$200 which assists in funding clothing, education and personal development activities.

Athlete will also be required to join the Nepean Rowing Club as a member-the normal membership fee for the Club is \$500 however this will be reduced by the Club and a payment of \$200 for membership will be required.

Any further costs associated with activities that may be organised such as camps-competition or race events will be advised during the program.
