Communication

Open communication between home and school is of tremendous benefit to the education and welfare of our students. There are many school staff members who spend time with your child or have responsibility for different aspects of school life, and it is often difficult to work out with whom you should be communicating. The following information should point you in the right direction. It should be used as a guide only – you are more than welcome to contact any of our staff regarding a concern or enquiry.

When leaving a message for a member of staff, please be patient while waiting for a return phone call. Staff members will endeavour to get back to you within two school days. There may, however, be times when teachers are teaching all periods during a day, are on an excursion or a professional development workshop that could make the turn around a little longer. If you are still unsure about who to contact, please briefly outline the issue to one of our office staff and they will be able to direct you to the appropriate person.

A great way to keep abreast of what is happening with your child at school is to attend our Parent/Teacher Interviews. It was wonderful to see so many of our Years 11-12 parents at this event on Tuesday 8 March, which was again conducted over Zoom.

These events provide a valuable opportunity for you to discuss the progress of your child directly with classroom teachers and talk about ways for them to improve. Parent/Teacher Interviews for Years 8 and 10 will be held in Term 2, followed by Years 7 and 9 in Term 3.

Other great ways to keep up to date with what is happening at the school include our school website, https://muirfield-h.schools.nsw.gov.au/ and using our Sentral parent portal, where you can access your child's attendance data, reports, rewards and the school calendar.

Attendance at school

Parents and carers of children of compulsory school age are responsible for ensuring their child attends school every day and on time. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

A reminder that if your child is a close contact or tests positive for COVID to please notify the school office as soon as possible. This is to ensure we can notify the community what grades are currently being affected.

Following an absence from school please ensure that you provide the school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence within 7 days. Parents will receive a text message when a student is absent (or late), and you may reply to this text with the reason.

Please note that weekly participation in sport is a mandatory requirement of all students in NSW schools. When making doctor/specialist appointments, please make every effort to avoid booking them during school hours, including sport time on Wednesday afternoons.

Families are encouraged to organise family trips only during school holiday periods. Every day away from school negatively affects achievement levels. Families planning to take their children out of school for a family trip outside of school vacation periods will be required to apply for leave by completing an Application for Extended Leave – Travel which is available from our front office. Uniform

Muirfield High School is proudly a uniform school and we expect that all students will show pride in their appearance and dress in the correct school uniform each day. By doing so, students indicate to their teachers that they are ready for learning and have the right mindset for learning.

With the cooler weather coming, we ask parents to ensure that their child has purchased the school jacket or jumper, and that they are wearing the correct school shorts, pants or skirt each day. Students are permitted to wear an undershirt if needed, however, this must be plain white. 'Hoodies' are not to be worn underneath the school jumper or jacket. Parents and students should be aware that the school may ask their child to remove their non-uniform jacket or jumper, even if they present a note from home, particularly if the non-uniform jacket is colourful, has a logo, inappropriate language, etc. In this instance, the student may be offered a school jacket or jumper as a loan item, if available. Black trackpants are not part of our uniform and should not be worn.

Muirfield has an extremely high rate of compliance with the school uniform policy and it is fantastic to work in a school where the majority of students take pride in their appearance and in their school uniform.











Compulsory School Attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards for homeschooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.





My child won't go to school. What should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education and Communities may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school.

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

 Compulsory Schooling Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

Application to the Children's Court

 Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department

may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

Working in Partnership

The Department of Education and Communities recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.

If a student misses as little as 8 days in a school term, by the end of primary school they'll have missed over a year of school.

COVID-19 Test and Isolate National Protocols

PROTOCOL 1

COVID-19 confirmed by a positive RAT or PCR test

- Isolate at home for at least 7 days from the day you had your test, if you have symptoms at Day 6, you must stay at home until symptoms are gone.
- 2 Notify your household, school or employer that you have tested positive.
- (3) If you have no symptoms at Day 7, you can return to normal living and leave your home. You do not need a further test.

Wear a mask when leaving the home and avoid visiting high-risk settings for at least 7 days following negative test or end of symptoms.

Always seek medical help if you become very unwell.

PROTOCOL 2

Close Contact and have symptoms

- Stay home for 7 days since you last had contact with the person who has COVID-19.
- 2 Take a RAT self-test or PCR test and stay at home while waiting for the test result.

If you test **positive** for COVID-19 follow **Protocol 1**. If you test **negative**, continue to stay at home.

- 3 On **Day 6** of isolation, take a RAT self-test.
 - If you test positive for COVID-19 follow Protocol 1

If your Day 6 test is **negative**, you can leave home and return to normal living after completing the 7 days of home isolation.

Wear a mask when leaving the home and avoid visiting high-risk settings for at least 14 days following exposure to the person with COVID-19.

Always seek medical help if you become very unwell.

PROTOCOL 3

Close Contact with no symptoms

 Monitor for symptoms and take a RAT self-test or PCR test if they develop.

If positive, follow Protocol 1.

If negative, continue to stay at home for 7 days, monitor for symptoms and follow Protocol 2 if they develop.

On Day 6 of isolation, take another RAT self-test.

If your Day 6 self-test is **positive**, follow **Protocol 1** – you do **NOT** need a PCR test for confirmation.

If your Day 6 self-test is negative and you have no symptoms, you can leave home and return to normal living after completing the 7 days of home isolation.

Wear a mask when leaving the home and avoid visiting high-risk settings for at least 14 days following exposure to the person with COVID-19.

PROTOCOL 4

Other contacts

If you have had less contact with someone with COVID-19, such as contact in a social, shopping, education or workplace setting.

 You should monitor for symptoms and have a RAT self-test if these occur.

If **positive**, follow **Protocol 1** and stay at home until until you no longer have symptoms.

Wear a mask when leaving the home and avoid visiting high-risk settings for at least 14 days following exposure to the person with COVID-19.

*WA, SA, NT & TAS residents should check their state or territory requirements and timelines

You are a Close Contact if you are living with someone who has COVID-19, or have spend 4 hours or longer with someone in a home or health or agod care environment since they developed COVID-19,

- If students are **late** to school parents will receive an SMS notification at 11am. Parents should respond to the SMS with an explanation
- If your child needs to leave school early, please send a note with the child to school which contains the date, child's name and reason for leaving early. They are to keep the note with them until it is time to leave. Show the note to the teacher at the beginning of the class. At the departure time take the note to the front office and sign out

Canteen

The Eftpos facilities has proven to be very popular and we have seen a sharp increase in Eftpos sales. The canteen now has a second Eftpos machine to speed up counter sales. We encourage our students and staff to pre-order their recess and lunch orders using Qkr! While we make extra hot meals for students and staff to purchase at lunch time, we are not able to accurately predict how many students and staff will pop in for a cooked meal and it happens that we are not able to supply a requested cooked lunch. Pre-ordering using Qkr! means students and staff will always get a cooked lunch.

We now have a feature on Qkr! where recess and lunch orders can be cancelled. If a recess or lunch order is placed and a student/staff member is not attending school on that day, the order can be cancelled on Qkr! and the order value will be added as a credit to your Qkr! profile. The next time you use Qkr! to order, the credit will be applied to the sale. Please note that orders can only be cancelled before the cut-off times. The cut-off time for recess is 9:00AM and lunch !0:00AM. Please give the canteen a call if you need any help with your Qkr! orders.

Eftpos payments for purchases under \$2 will incur a 10c fee. Items that are sold for less than \$2 have very small markups and it's difficult to absorb the Eftpos fees for these purchases.

Now that year cohorting is no longer a requirement, we have changed the line-up arrangements for students at the canteen windows. Juniors and seniors now have shared windows. We have a separate window for all preordered food and drinks so that students who have pre-ordered their meals can get it quickly. The window for pre-ordered food faces the entrance to the school hall. Students must have their student ID card ready when collecting their orders.
