# **Guitar Skills**

# **TERM 2 – Piano/Keyboard Introduction**

# **Keyboard Skills**

This is an introductory unit to the piano and keyboard. Students will learn about the history and anatomy of the instrument, formal notation, chords, scales, and technique. Subsequently, this knowledge and skill set will then be applied to perform a number of basic pieces on the piano. Summative assessment will be focused on individual performance skills, whilst formative assessment will cover ensemble work and individual progress on the instrument. 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#### **TERM 3 – Vocal Introduction**

#### **Vocal Skills**

In this topic, students learn the rudimentary basics of vocals, which includes researching, composing and performance. Anatomy of the singing voice as an instrument is a prime focus, as well as note reading and writing for the purposes of composition. During this vocal unit, students will have the opportunity to work in small groups to compose their own original pieces using interactive programs such as Incredibox and Bandlab. Students will also rehearse and perform their compositions as part of their formative assessment. Musicology and Aural skills are applied through listening to and analysing a range of vocal music.
